## places and faces

**SPENDING DURING** the June 10 Wayne-Westland school tax election was down among supporters from the previous tax election, the latest expense reports at the county elections office show.

The pro-millage Save Our Schools citizens group spent \$3,343 on the June 10 election, compared to the \$7,486 spent on the March 13 election. A 7.75-mill proposal failed in March and was approved in June.

The Wayne-Westland Citizens for Education Committee, which fought the millage, spent \$793 in the June election — an increase over the \$268 that it spent in March, records show.

**HIX ROAD** will be completely closed between Warren and Laramie for five to six weeks as the city makes improvements in the Tonquish Creek area. The closing is expected to occur about Aug. 21.

On other parts of Hix, traffic will be moved to the newly poured concrete on the east side as construction begins on the west half of the road. City officials are asking motorists to observe all detour signs.

Also, Hix Road east of the Tonquish Creek are encouraged to use Joy Road for the nearest east-west route, said city economic development director Scott Veldhuis, who described the progress on the Hix project as "excellent."

**WESTLAND'S 18TH** District Court is seeking people to serve as volunteer probation officers. There are now 21 volunteers in the program initiated by Judge Thomas Smith. The program was set up in part so that people sentenced to probation could keep their day jobs and still report to the court.

Volunteers typically spend three hours a month (on two evenings) seeing probationers. They work on Mondays and Thursdays.

"The amount of time and days that a volunteer spends here is up to them, since it would depend on the amount of cases they would like to take," Christopher Raymond, the court's probation officer, has said.

**KIRK GRONDA**, a University of Michigan graduate who has been teaching music in the Lansing area, has been selected as the new instrumental music director at Wayne Memorial High School. Officers of the band and orchestra booster club, along with student officers, recently met with Gronda, and they have said they were impressed with his enthusiasm, energy and concern for the student program. Gronda has told the booster club he wants to create a program of stability for Wayne Memorial.

**THE CITYWIDE** has on-daytime lawn sprinkling, ordered Aug. 7 to beat water pressure, prompted the canceling of a planned water ball fight Saturday at the Westland fire department's public awareness committee all-time fire muster.

By the way, the ban on lawn watering remains in effect. The ban prohibits lawn sprinkling between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. until further notice. When Mayor Robert Thomas announced the ban, water pressure was less than half normal, creating problems in firefighting and businesses which use a large quantity of water.

## Cooper cancer study under way

A study to find out if there is an unusually high rate of cancer in the Cooper School neighborhood is halfway done and may be ready in about a week or two, said Dr. Donald Lawrenchuk, Wayne County health department director.

The Michigan Cancer Foundation undertook the study about 10 days ago, Lawrenchuk told the Observer Friday afternoon. The study is about halfway done, and an analysis could be ready the week of Aug. 26, he said.

The study was requested by Lawrenchuk in

the wake of residents' fears and concerns about public health risks in the area near Cooper Elementary School, on Ann Arbor Trail between Middlebelt and Inkster in Westland.

Residents in the area are fearful of the public health risks in the wake of numerous disclosures that the school, built in the mid-1960s, sits atop a former landfill.

The health director said the Michigan Cancer Foundation has done many studies of cancer rates in the past 18 years, based on computerized statistics.

"EVERY CANCER diagnosis made by a physician is reported to the cancer foundation

which enters the information in its computer," Lawrenchuk said. The rates of cancer can be traced by census tract, he said.

The regional statistics are up-to-date through 1989, he added.

Lawrenchuk said that on Aug. 6 he asked that the foundation study the Cooper school area because "we want a better picture of what's going on."

The director said requests for cancer rate studies through the foundation are done "on a fairly regular basis."

The study will compare the neighborhood with the rest of the city of Westland, he said.

In his letter to the foundation, Lawrenchuk mentioned a number of local residents have

expressed health concerns regarding the incidence of cancer in this area and any assistance which the (foundation) can provide would be greatly appreciated."

Residents in the area have been upset for four months after finding out that the school grounds contain toxic chemicals.

The school is closed pending the cleanup of chemicals found in the soil.

Besides the public health fears, Lawrenchuk said several children in the neighborhood are having emotional problems.

"Some youngsters are having nightmares and are afraid to go outside to play for fear of getting cancer," he said.

## Teen killed in fall from moving van

Two children hurt in four-car crash, 2A

A Romulus teenager riding in a van with the side door open was killed in Westland Thursday night after she fell from the moving vehicle.

Jennifer Lynn Cooley, 17, died from injuries she received during the 9:30 p.m. incident on Grand Traverse, east of Centerville, in the Norwayne neighborhood.

Cooley, who fell from the passenger-side sliding door of the Chevy van, was dead on arrival at Ann Arbor Hospital, Wayne. She received multiple injuries, including head injuries, a hospital spokeswoman said.

Cooley was among four people in the van being driven eastbound on Grand Traverse by Regina Beth Borders, 17, of Westland.

Additional details about the incident, including what caused Cooley to fall through the van door, were not immediately known Friday. Alcohol was not involved, according to Westland police.

The incident remained under investigation Friday by the police department's traffic bureau.

Cooley's cousin, 16-year-old Sandy Williams, described her as "a quiet, caring person who was fun to be around."

## Attorney calls shooting 'tragic'

A Westland man blamed for shooting his wife's male companion, amid a marital breakup, has been described by his attorney as a responsible, hard worker who has no prior criminal record.

Donald Gibbs, 40, charged with shooting 29-year-old Martin Gedert of Detroit, appears to be "a pretty responsible guy" employed in the same auto industry job for 22 years, defense attorney Thomas A. Howard said Thursday.

"He has absolutely no criminal record," Howard said. "He has a very bad drinking problem."

Howard described as "tragic" the incident in which Westland police accused Gibbs of firing a pistol shot that injured Gedert's left thigh. Gedert, who underwent surgery, is recovering.

"It should never have occurred," Howard said of the 2:30 a.m. incident on Saturday, Aug. 3.

Howard's comments came Thursday after Gibbs appeared in West-

## Back to the future Artist creates winning poster design

Janice Lebedeff of Westland combined the old and new to win a \$1,500 award for a design used for the 1991 Michigan Renaissance Festival poster.

The posters are used to promote the festival, which opened last weekend and will be on subsequent weekends through Sept. 28-29.

Lebedeff, 22, the daughter of Gerald and Nadia Lebedeff, used the competition prize to pay for part of her tuition at Center for Creative Studies in Detroit. She graduated this spring and now works for the SB&A advertising agency in Ann Arbor.

The artist has won five other awards as a CCS student or SB&A employee.

The poster's design shows a male figure wearing Middle Ages era clothing, with a modern 35-mm camera hanging from his neck, holding a Michigan map with the festival location at Holly highlighted.

Previous Renaissance Festival posters were illustrations.

"I wanted to combine an illustration and photograph," said Lebedeff, a 1987 Franklin High School graduate.

She also wanted something of a "Back to the Future" movie touch.

# Two children hurt in crash

Westland police expect that a felonious driving charge may emerge from a four-vehicle accident in Westland that injured two young Taylor children, leaving one hospitalized with a fractured skull.

"We have a suspect," said police Sgt. Peter Brokas. "The case is still under investigation."

Conflicting reports emerged during an investigation of the 5:30 p.m. Aug. 10 accident at Van Born and Middlebelt that injured Ronald John Gering, 6, and his 4-year-old sister, Ashley.

Ronald Gering, who received a fractured skull, was airlifted to the University of Michigan Medical Center, Ann Arbor, where he was listed in good condition Friday afternoon. Ashley Gering was treated and released at Ann Arbor Hospital in Wayne.

Conflicting reports emerged during a police investigation of the accident, police officer James Dexter said.

He indicated that one scenario was that two vehicles westbound on Van Born were involved in a "cat and mouse" game until one of the cars lost control and smashed into an eastbound vehicle carrying

four people, including the Gering children and their mother, identified as Justine A. Smock, 26, of Taylor.

**THE IMPACT** forced Smock's vehicle backward, and it then struck another eastbound vehicle carrying five people, including the driver, 54-year-old William D. Olinger of Rochester Hills, according to police.

Of the two westbound vehicles, one driver fled the scene. Police have learned the driver's identity, but have not released it.

The second vehicle, which flipped over after it struck and virtually demolished Smock's car, was driven by a 27-year-old Detroit man — one of three people in the car.

The 27-year-old told police that he had been forced into Smock's lane by the driver who fled the scene. However, some witnesses told police that the two westbound vehicles had been "traveling recklessly" at an excessive speed, making "erratic lane changes and cutting off other vehicles," according to a police report.

Westland police continued to investigate the case last week, and expected that charges could be filed this week.

"She liked to have fun," Williams said. "We were like best friends."

Cooley, the only child of Daniel and Gloria Cooley of Romulus, would have been a senior this fall at Romulus High School, Williams said.

Cooley's hobbies included music, the cousin said.

"She liked all kinds of music," Williams said. "She liked heavy metal, but she also liked country music and other kinds, too."

A close friend of Jennifer's since

the fourth grade also recalled the life of the traffic victim.

The friend, who asked that her identity not be published, said that Jennifer was "perfect, a straight-A student, on the honor roll, in the school band, and had everything going for her."

The friend added that she was sitting in the front passenger seat of the van when Jennifer fell out when the van stopped at a stop sign. The friend said she didn't see the incident but heard another passenger yell that "Jennie fell."

Services were to be held today.

land's 18th District Court for a preliminary examination before Judge Thomas G. Smith.

The exam had been scheduled to determine whether Gibbs should be tried on a charge of assault with intent to commit murder. He also has been charged with a felony firearms violation.

**GIBBS ASKED** that the exam be waived, meaning his case will automatically be sent to Detroit Recorder's Court for trial.

During an Aug. 5 arraignment in 18th District Court, a plea of not guilty was entered on Gibbs' behalf.

Police accused Gibbs of shooting Gedert once in the left thigh after Gibbs went to see his wife, Denise, at their Glen Street residence and found Gedert there.

Police Sgt. Russell Nowaczek said Gibbs ordered Gedert out of the house and then chased him down the street before firing the shot. The incident erupted amid ongoing divorce proceedings between Gibbs and his wife, according to Nowaczek.

## New music program set for launch

Organizers of a long-planned effort to expand music education in the Wayne-Westland area are prepared to launch a new program next month for enthusiasts of concert band, chorus, orchestra and jazz.

The Wayne-Westland Youth Music Program Inc. wants to supplement school-based music education by forming groups to study and perform in local communities, board chairman Randy Blouse said.

"It's an opportunity for the motivated student to go one step further," he said.

Organizers hope to draw as many as 300 participants for a 12-week fall program. They also are planning a 16-week program for the winter and spring.

The project will include advanced and intermediate performing groups in concert band, string orchestra and chorus. Groups for beginners will be organized if enough interest is shown, Blouse said.

At this point, the jazz division will be geared toward advanced musicians only, he said.

**THE PROGRAM** will be open to musicians ages 9 to 21. Organizers plan to hold auditions for the various groups on Sept. 14, and a time and location will be announced soon. Rehearsals will begin two days later.

The programs have drawn the attention of the Westland and Wayne city councils, which have passed resolutions endorsing the effort.

"Both cities have been very supporting and cooperative," Blouse said.

W. Scott Ponzani, who will direct the choral divisions, called the program "a unique opportunity" and said it will give participants "a chance to take that extra step and have more opportunities for music expression."

To offset expenses for the non-profit program, tuition will be charged. For the fall session, tuition will be \$120 for Wayne-Westland school district residents and \$132 for non-residents. Tuition will be \$180 for the jazz group.

The program is not designed to detract from school programs, Blouse said. In fact, organizers highly recommend that school-age participants be enrolled in a school music program.

## Murder exam delayed, attorney sought

## MADD offers scholarships

A new scholarship program has been established by Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), Michigan and is now being offered to victims of drunk driving crashes.

The completed application deadline is Sept. 10, 1991. Scholarship recipients will be notified by Oct. 15, 1991.

## SC poll says suburbanites less likely to visit city now

Suburbanites believe there is plenty to do in downtown Detroit, but a new poll indicates many are just too scared to go there.

The poll indicates violence during this year's Freedom Festival fireworks display made many suburbanites less likely to visit Detroit. Poll results are based on random interviews conducted Aug. 5-12 by Schoolcraft College sociology students.

Poll results show nearly two-thirds of the nearly 400 people surveyed said they were less likely to visit the city as a result of the widely reported attacks on suburban women and their perception of how the incident was handled by Detroit police.

In contrast, the overwhelming

majority of those surveyed in the Schoolcraft student poll said they believed the city contained interesting activities not available in suburban communities.

**RESULTS STAND** in sharp contrast to an earlier Detroit Free Press poll that found only 23.5 percent of those surveyed were less likely to visit the city as a result of the incident.

Of those polled by Schoolcraft students:

- 63.9 percent said they were less likely to attend Detroit events in the future, the figure contrasts with 23.5 percent who responded to a similar question in the Free Press poll. In contrast, 33.2 percent said such incidents wouldn't affect their decision to attend Detroit events.

An additional 70.5 percent said "my feeling police security is inad-

equated" played a role in their decisions not to attend events. But 26.8 percent disagreed police security — or its alleged lack — played a role in decisions whether to attend Detroit events.

- 86.4 percent, however, said there were "interesting things" to do in Detroit; 78.5 percent said the city had "attractions not equaled by the suburbs."

- 69.8 percent called media coverage of the incident "fair and objective" while 88.2 percent said they believed not all violence was reported by the media.

"It shows suburbanites reaction to Detroit was strongly affected by the fireworks incident," said poll supervisor Conrad Behler, a part-time sociology instructor at the Livonia-based community college.

## Building on past success

The Difference should not be releasing "Groundswell" with its \$30,000-plus price tag. At least not with their own money.

Past accolades would have people predicting a better fate for the five-man band of funkmeisters. After all, wasn't this the band that MTV called "Best College Band in the Nation" in 1988 and that *Musical* magazine picked as one of top 15 best unsigned bands in the country the same year?

Drummer Tom Campbell wearily nods his head yes.

"We sort of sat back and thought record companies would approach us," said Campbell in the living room of his Whitmore Lake home. "They didn't."

"We were a little naive about it. What we should have done was walk into their offices and crammed it down their throat."

Major labels better invest in some throat lozenges, as "Groundswell" is headed for the industry's collective tonsils.

The self-produced compact disc was 2½ years in the making, recorded and mixed at three different studios, such as Producer's Color in Southfield and the Schoolhouse and Solid Sound in Ann Arbor. The band, instead of a record label, is paying the bill for its release.

YES, THIS is crunch time. Yes, this is the release to either put the band over the top or leave them languishing as one of those who could've, should've but never did.

Any repeat of past history is unlikely, especially judging by the infectious energy emanating throughout "Groundswell."

The Difference has always been able to tap the source in live shows, which have always been sultry groove-infested affairs burning the wax off of dance floors. Bassist Randy Martin double-jointed gyrations alone are a sight to behold.

But try getting that on record or as Campbell put it, "Energy is tough to capture in binary code."

The Difference's previous two projects have been wayward at best, including a five-song EP "Culture Shock" that was recorded in New York with studio time won in the MTV contest. The project was never released.

"Our first couple of projects we didn't feel represented our music the way we liked," Campbell said. "People also commented that they thought the live show was better."

"Groundswell" reveals a group as something more than a funk-inspired aerobics session. Stirling rhythm blues, mystical Celtic soul and flat-out rock'n'roll are detected on the 13-song effort on the band's own label, Bad Dog.

shopping the compact disc. Already the CD is getting air play on college radio.

If anything, "Groundswell" is an injection of morale for a band whose members were glum. The studio offered rejuvenation.

"This time it was a lot more creative," Gouda said. "We had a better engineer (Geoff Michael). He was working real hard to get our ideas across."

"It was nerve-wracking," Campbell added. "Being in the studio

was a joy. We opened our minds this time. We let everybody do what they wanted. We had fun.

"The nerve-wracking part was the differences in opinion over the remixing. It's like writing a book but writing it with four other authors. All of you have to agree."

Through the bleak times, live shows helped sustain the Difference. The group continued to forge ahead, performing up to 10 shows a month across the Midwest and the East Coast.

"There are some hard times

when you start wondering what's wrong with the music industry or what's with your music," Gouda said. "If you're sincere about your music and it's a part of you, it won't burn out."

With the CD, the band wants to make up the difference between live shows and a recorded product.

"I think it's a contrast; we've attempted to merge them instead of separate them," Campbell said. "I think we go with what we go with on stage. That's one of the ways we've grown up."

It is believed to be the first such poll conducted after initial publicity concerning the incident had died down.

"I KNOW there are people who are working hard to repair the city's image, and I think they should be aware of this," said Behler, a Livonia resident who also teaches at Grosse Pointe North High School.

Polling was conducted by 14 students in Behler's Sociology 201 class.

Most interviews were conducted

door-to-door, he said, though an unspecified number were conducted by telephone.

Of the 391 people polled, no breakdown was given for race, age or sex, though Behler said several respondents indicated they had attended the fireworks display, the exact number wasn't compiled.

Not every respondent answered every question. Total responses ranged from 390 to 380, depending upon the question. (See related story on Page 7A for a list of questions asked.)

## SC poll results outlined

Student pollsters asked respondents for their reaction to these statements. Respondents were asked whether they somewhat agreed, strongly agreed, somewhat disagreed or strongly disagreed with each statement.

1. There are interesting things to do in Detroit.

Strongly agree, 176; somewhat agree, 162; somewhat disagree, 38; strongly disagree, 16.

2. Detroit has certain public attractions not equaled by the suburbs.

Strongly agree, 165; somewhat agree, 142; somewhat disagree, 56; strongly disagree, 20.

3. Of all the reasons (such as time, distance, etc.) that I do not go downtown more often for public activities, one of the most important is my feeling police security is inadequate for effective crowd control.

Strongly agree, 172; somewhat agree, 104; somewhat disagree, 68; strongly disagree, 37.

4. I believe that there may be instances of gang or street violence unreported by the media.

Strongly agree, 238; somewhat agree, 107; somewhat disagree, 22; strongly disagree, 18.

5. In my opinion, newspaper and television coverage of the assaults at the Freedom Festival fireworks display constituted fair and objective reporting.

Strongly agree, 143; somewhat agree, 130; somewhat disagree, 78; strongly disagree, 29.

6. My reaction to these incidents, coupled with my perception of how the Detroit police handled them, makes it less likely that I will attend public events downtown in the future.

Strongly agree, 152; somewhat agree, 98; somewhat disagree, 63; strongly disagree, 67.

# Somebody get a nurse!

## Survey finds nursing shortage continues

Michigan's nursing shortage isn't likely to end any time soon, area hospital administrators said, but nursing school officials hope steps taken now will ease the shortage by decade's end.

A recent Michigan Hospital Association survey indicated a nursing vacancy rate of 13.6 percent for Michigan hospitals — well above the national average of 8.7 percent.

The survey didn't examine the reasons for the nursing shortage. "We really didn't look at that, but we do have some theories," MHA spokeswoman Nancy Fiedler said. "Vacancies are generally higher in rural areas and Michigan has considerably more rural hospitals than other states. Michigan also is a leader in the number of outpatient clinics it has and some nurses leave hospitals to work in an outpatient setting."

There is also a difference in pay between urban and rural registered nurses.

Nurses in urban hospitals earn \$15.62 an hour, compared with \$13.41 for nurses in rural hospitals, according to a recent survey by the William M. Mercer Co. of Detroit.

The shortage is no secret to area hospitals, where administrators have been scrambling to fill nursing spots.

"There's no question we've had a nursing shortage for some time now," said Allan Breakie, president

of Garden City Osteopathic Hospital. Garden City Osteopathic has tapped into "rent-a-nurse" programs to keep staff levels high. Fill-in nurses circulate from hospital to hospital, filling in as needed.

"WE'D LIKE to get away from that, though," Breakie said. "That's a pretty expensive way to go."

Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills has created an in-house program for fill-in nurses.

"We haven't had to use temporaries as other hospitals have," Botsford president Gerson Cooper said.

Job sharing programs, four-day work weeks and on-site child care, have helped Botsford keep vacancies from exceeding five percent, Cooper said.

Neither Garden City Osteopathic nor Botsford participated in the hospital association survey.

St. Mary Hospital, Livonia, which participated in the survey, has also built an in-house nursing pool.

St. Mary, affiliated with nearby Madonna University, also draws nursing students.

"We have students from Madonna, Schoolcraft College and Henry Ford Community College," St. Mary nursing director Audrey Zavodsky said.

Madonna is one of Michigan's largest nursing schools and administrators say enrollments are on the rise.

"We had 283 inquiries about our program in the last month," said Dr. Mary Wawrzynski, dean of the Ma-

donna school of nursing and health. Still, Madonna administrators see no major boost in nurses for several years.

"DEMAND IS going to be outstripping supply for many, many years," Wawrzynski said.

One recent survey foresaw demand for an additional 600,000 nurses, on top of those already needed, Wawrzynski said.

Keeping up, she added, means targeting increasingly younger students.

"We've distributed brochures among middle schools and we've sent coloring books to grade schoolers," she said. "The feeling is, it's never too early for someone to become interested in nursing."

An additional program — nursing as a second career — is not yet in place.

"It would be for people thinking about nursing as a second degree option," Wawrzynski said.

The Livonia-based university recently began a series of joint programs with Schoolcraft, Oakland, Henry Ford and Highland Park community colleges, allowing community college nursing students to complete a four-year degree with minimal loss of credit.

The end result, Wawrzynski said, is that registered nurses can be placed into the field sooner.

Getting nurses into the field quickly is also the focus of Schoolcraft's licensed practical nursing and nursing associate's degree program. Enrollment in each program has been high.

"We have waiting lists," said Midge Carleton, assistant dean of the college's allied health/physical science department.

In addition, Schoolcraft has begun refresher courses for nurses returning to the field.

"We believe this is going to help ease the nursing shortage," Carleton said.

I looked at my \$200 L.L. Bean fly rod and thought for a moment. It was a kid's question. No, I hadn't, was my response. He tried it and hooked onto a nice size brook trout.

It made me wonder why I paid so much money for a rod that probably wasn't necessary. A quote from Spanish writer Jose Ortega y Gasset roughly says: If you buy enough of something, you can be it.

It kind of explains why we spend so much on sporting equipment.

THIS SUMMER I watched two kayakers spend the day on a beach in the Pictured Rocks in the Upper

Peninsula doing nothing but fiddling with their equipment.

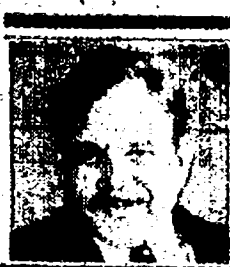
They looked as though they had purchased everything the L.L. Bean catalogue had to offer, lock, stock and backpacking stove.

It was a wonder they fit it in just two kayaks. It's not a problem the Indians had to face. They didn't have L.L. Bean to tell them what they needed to survive a canoe trip.

The two kayakers missed out on a perfect day at the beach because they were field testing their equipment.

And I think that's happening a lot these days.

Sports aren't sports anymore. It's all equipment and status. The fun's gone for adults. Watching our children play and then following their lead, is the only way out of the

AFTER WATCHING the kayakers, my son and I were hiking back to our car from the beach. And as we walked, we were almost trampled and made deaf by a herd of runners. I don't know what was worse, dodging them or listening to them whine about the uneven trail, the wrong shoes or their aches and pains.

And of course all the runners were clad in the latest gear, with running

shoes that cost more than a third world family earns in a year.

Later in the week as I was driving in the Leelanau Peninsula, I watched as a grown man in his 40s bicycled next to me. This man was ready for the Tour de France. He was also a prime example of why the fabric Spandex can be worn by few people over the age of 19. The only exceptions are anorexics from third world countries.

The man's head was down in the classic racer's position. He was in training. But for what? A five mile race in Traverse City?

It's not that I'm against exercise, it's just that we've taken the play out of it, especially for adults.

HERE'S A LIST of things adults do with much expense that kids do just for the fun of it and at much less cost:

• **Golf:** It's nothing more than just walking around whacking a ball with a stick. Kids do that when they're 2 years old. And they don't worry about their score.

• **Fly fishing:** It's nothing more than wandering around in a river or lake catching fish with a \$400 rod and flies that can cost up to \$5. It's really the same thing as wading into a creek, catching frogs and putting them into a jar. And the cost? The price of any empty jar.

• **Bicycle racing:** God knows the price of those mountain bikes. Then there's the Spandex suit. If you're a male, you just have to hope Dolly Parton doesn't enter the race. Watch a kid-ride a bike sometime. They don't need the helmets, mountain bikes, Spandex suits or races.

• **Running:** Only adults need to buy shoes that cost as much as a South American family earns in a year in order to run. Try catching a barefoot kid sometime and the question of shoes should be settled.

LATER ON my vacation I sat watching my kid swinging a bat behind the farm house we were at. He had a bat, but no balls. But there was an apple tree. He quickly made the connection and in no time was using the fallen apples as balls.

We could all learn a lesson from that.

# Public loses interest in fighting crusaders

"WHAT'S HAPPENING to our freedoms?" a co-worker asked me recently. "It seems like every time you turn around, they've taken another one away. Why don't you write a column about that?"

What had set my friend off this time was that massive abortion protest down in Wichita, Kan., where hundreds of members of Operation Rescue had laid siege to two clinics and vowed to shut them down. Never mind that the clinics were perfectly legal operations. That small point has never bothered Operation Rescue.

And that is part of the problem. The crusaders don't care whether something is legal or not. If they don't like it, they're bound and determined to run it out of town.

But the other part of the problem is why the people who think the crusaders are wrong don't fight back.

CASE IN point: A while back I wrote a column chastising those who paraded in front of a Livonia abortion clinic with signs bearing the names of two patients who were, they said, in the clinic to have abortions.

The column infuriated the pro-

lifers, who bombarded me and the paper with letters and phone calls. Other people, however, sought me out. Two phone calls to my desk led to rather lengthy conversations with the callers, both of whom said they just wanted to tell me that I was absolutely right and it's about time somebody spoke out against activities like that.

But when I suggested to the callers that they put their thoughts in writing and send a letter to the editor, they quickly backed off. One caller said he was a minister who was rather visible in his community and didn't think he should get involved. The other was a woman who

said she was a candidate for political office and she didn't think it would be wise to put her views in a letter.

So there they sit — quietly. It doesn't really matter whether they are members of a silent majority or a silent minority. As long as they remain silent, it doesn't matter at all.

SECOND CASE: The 36th state House district — which includes all or parts of Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville, Northville Township and Canton Township — recently held a special primary election to replace Gerald Law, who had resigned the seat.

On most issues there was little difference in the views of the three can-

didates. The only area on which they disagreed sharply was the abortion question.

Jerry Vorva, a Plymouth city commissioner, was adamantly pro-choice. Deborah Whyman, a political newcomer, was staunchly pro-life. Georgina Goss, Northville Township supervisor and a political veteran, refused to be labeled on the issue. Both sides accused her of waffling.

Whether the abortion question was a central issue among voters is anybody's guess, but the pro-lifers were out in force backing Whyman and the pro-choicers were out stumping for Vorva. Goss ended up the winner with a strong showing in Northville,

but Whyman, who came in third, was only 544 votes behind Goss.

Abortion questions aside, this was a chance for voters to select the person who would represent their district in the Legislature. The turnout was dismal. About 20 percent of registered voters cast ballots in Plymouth, in Plymouth Township fewer than 17 percent turned out and in Canton only 8 1/2 percent of the registered voters actually voted.

Whyman, who won in Canton where she lives, did so with 805 votes — 3.4 percent of the registered voters!

What's happening to our freedoms? Do you really care?

# Taxpayers pick up travel tab for reps

Plane loads of lawmakers, their aides and often spouses too streaked repeatedly through international skies last year, as more than half the House membership took hundreds of official trips ranging from important business to nationally televised junketing.

Democrats Stephen J. Solarz of New York and Bill Richardson of New Mexico were the leading travelers among the 238 members who made house calls on foreign ports at taxpayer expense, according to Roll Call Report Syndicate's second annual survey of congressional globe-trotting.

Solarz spent the most days outside the United States, 64, on six trips to 27 countries. Richardson had the most trips, seven, spending 42 days in at least 10 countries.

Other House leaders, each with five trips and at least three weeks overseas, were Maryland Republican Helen Delich Bentley and Democrats Jaime Fuster of Puerto Rico, Dennis M. Hertel of Michigan, Jim Moody of Wisconsin, Solomon P. Ortiz of Texas and Charles B. Rangel of New York.

THE 238 HOUSE members, including several who left office at the end of 1990, took 517 trips over 3,239 days to 1,086 countries at a cost reported by committees at \$5.8 million. Roll Call Report's 1989 survey identified 214 members making 419 trips over 3,048 days to 929 countries, at a committee-stated cost of \$4.5 million. The cost figures also cover staff travel overseas.

The survey did not cover Senate travel or House members' extensive global travel at the expense of special interests.

It is based on reports that committees are required to file for publication in the Congressional Record. The reports do not state what the trips accomplish, nor indicate when spouses go along. But when the travel involves military aircraft, as most

trips do, the Pentagon makes a public listing of passengers including spouses.

One Defense Department manifest shows that a four-day Foreign Affairs Committee visit to Paris in May, for a NATO parliamentary conference, included the spouses of these members: Republicans William S. Broomfield of Michigan, Gerald B.H. Solomon of New York, Thomas J. Bliley of Virginia, Jan Meyers of Kansas and Alex McCrill of North Carolina and Democrats Dante B. Fascell of Florida, Jack Brooks of Texas, Ronald D. Coleman of Texas, James Bilbray of Nevada and Nancy Pelosi of California.

CONSISTENT with House rules and custom the spouses' transportation was free because they filled otherwise empty seats on the Air Force plane.

House practice also permitted spousal lodging to be covered by the approximately \$300 per diem each lawmaker received from taxpayers for daily expense in Paris.

Several of the Houses' 1989 travel leaders were much less footloose in 1990. For example, California Democrat Mervyn Dymally had the most trips in 1989, eight, and the most days away, 59. He cut that to three trips and 28 days in 1990. California Republican David Dreier, who took the second most trips in 1989, six, was shown in committee records as going abroad only three times in 1990 on official business.

Trips abroad are almost always scheduled to avoid conflicts with legislative business. But some members still manage to miss record votes because of their travel.

IN THE "VOTE" category — roll calls missed as a result of jetting

abroad — the 1990 leader was Texas' de la Garza, with 14 no-shows recorded during an Agriculture Committee trip to Mexico in June.

Maryland's Bentley was absent for eight votes while visiting Eastern Europe in May. Ohio Democrat Edward F. Feighan missed eight roll calls as a result of an April trip to Cyprus and Oregon Democrat Les AuCoin missed four votes because of a June trip to Switzerland.

While lawmakers made more trips to war mobilization areas of the Persian Gulf than any other destination, they also flocked to such perennial pleasure zones as Paris, London, Vienna, Brussels, Bonn and Zurich.

Barbados, normally a coveted port, proved less hospitable than expected to nine House members who stopped there in April for a few days

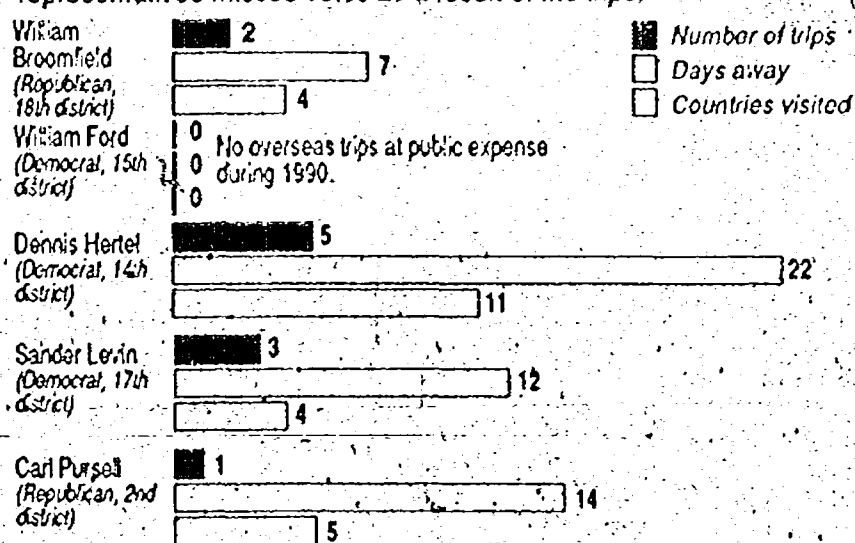
at or near the beach. Each member and staff aide had a per diem allowance of at least \$235, according to committee records.

Hidden ABC news cameras also showed up, giving taxpayers their first nationally televised view of a congressional junket in progress when the visit was later featured on the network's "Prime Time Live" program.

According to House records, the lawmakers nabbed at Barbados by Sam Donaldson and crew were Dan Rostenkowski and Marty Russo of Illinois, Thomas J. Downey of New York, George Miller and Peter Stark of California and Barbara B. Kennel of Connecticut and Republicans Raymond J. McGrath of New York, Richard Schulze of Pennsylvania and Guy Vander Jagt of Michigan.

**ROLE OF GOLD THERAPY IN RHEUMATOID ARTHRITIS**

You may have read that recent research found that gold injections, a basic therapy in rheumatoid arthritis, is "of no value."

What the investigation showed was that at the end of five years the degree of impairment differed little between patients who had received gold therapy and those who did not.

Physicians who treat patients with rheumatoid arthritis had no quarrel with the results of the study. However, the investigators did not take into account that the way of life, differed between the group receiving gold injections and the group that did not.

Gold injections may not stop impairment, but the therapy diminishes pain. The patient can ambulate and continue activity to a substantially greater degree than the patient not taking gold.

Perhaps in five years the impairment of grasp, reach, gait and grip are the same in the two groups. But individuals on gold therapy have more days that are "good" days than the group not using gold.

The term "quality of life" is often used as a slogan. However, the phrase has meaning when applied to gold therapy. As this medication improves the way a patient lives day by day, gold injections will remain a part of a physician's response to a patient's need.

## Daly loads up for Oklahoma

Daly Restaurant, which recently completed its Livonia league season with a perfect 15-0 record, will be among the favorites in the Women's Class A Fast-Pitch National Championships, Aug. 22-25 in Enid, Okla.

"What are our chances?" said Daly Restaurant manager Bob Thompson. "On paper we should be one of the pre-tournament favorites. After four appearances in a national tournament, you tread cautiously about the outcome."

"The two years we felt we had a lock on it, we finished 17th and 22nd, respectively."

Thompson's unheralded teams finished second twice, losing to San Diego in 1987 and Bay City in 1989.

Daly embarks on its trip Wednesday for Oklahoma with a 41-9 overall record, including a pair of wins recently over rival Great Scott in the Livonia Parks and Recreation Women's Fast-Pitch League, 5-2 and 4-3.

Great Scott pitcher Lisa McCarthy, a Novi High product who will be a senior this fall at Alma College, has been added to the Daly roster for the nationals.

"As a pick-up player, she not only adds strength to our pitching staff, but she also plays two or three other infield positions," Thompson said.

"And she is also the leading fast-pitch hitting pitcher in this area."

DALY WILL also be very comfortable on the mound with eight-year veteran hurler Shelley Larned, a Miami of Ohio product and two-time American Softball Association All-American.

Larned currently sports a 1.08 earned run average to go along with her 21-6 record. She has an eye-popping 201 strikeouts in 188 innings.

Meanwhile, Hope College's Lisa Walters adds a 1.46 ERA and the team's top win-loss percentage (.882) with a 15-2 record to an already impressive list of pitchers.

Daly will also depend on three catchers, including the University of Michigan's Karla Kunnen, who is batting .380; Hope's Deb Vashaw (.292); and University of Detroit Mercy's Cris Wasserman (.286).

"For Vashaw and Wasserman, this will be their first out-of-state trip due to heavy summer employment hours," Thompson said. "Kunnen has

pulled the load alone admirably on the road, although she almost buckled twice in the heat at Chattanooga, Tenn. and St. Louis, Mo."

Daly's outfield will be anchored by former NCAA All-American Angie McDonald (.407), an Eastern Michigan University product, and Pam Ossenhimer (.318).

The third outfield spot will be divided by Wayne State standout Paula Harms (.282), Michigan's Karl Kunnen (.311) and Wasserman.

HARMS ALSO does double duty at shortstop along with Kim Funk (.265 and five homers), while Karl Kunnen works at third base with former Michigan player Alicia Seeger.

Filling out the rest of the Daly squad will be Heather Walters of South Lyon High, Deb Szymczak of Central Michigan and Michaelene Bachleda.

At Wayne State, Bachleda was a three-time Division II All-American under coach Gary Bryce. The team's batting average (.426) and RBI leader (.33), Bachleda will spend most of her time at first base for Thompson.

Walters, who has been with Daly's for two seasons, will be the youngest player making the trip. She will be entering Oakland Community College this fall as a freshman.

# RU product walking beat for EMU

Dave Marshall's major is law enforcement, so it's ironic he has only one more year of duty with Eastern Michigan University football squad.

"I'm a criminal justice major, I want to be a cop," said the fifth-year senior from Redford Union High. "My dad (Herman) is a retired Detroit cop. He worked 25 years on the force. I don't want to get into a kind of job where I'm busting kids for breaking windows all my life, but I'm willing to start there. It's something I've always wanted to get into."

Marshall, who is moving from defensive back to outside linebacker in the Eagles' (formerly the Hurons) new defensive scheme, has had enough of foot patrol. He's ready to move up the ranks and play more of a role in EMU's upcoming season.

"I'm really optimistic," said Marshall, who will graduate next spring. "Right now I'm No. 2 at outside linebacker, Fred McClendon (a return-

ing starter) is a big, strong linebacker-type, whereas I'll play in nickel situations. I'll be able to drop back on pass plays and have to come up and hit on the run. All I can do is give it my all and try to beat Fred out."

MARSHALL, who has beefed up his 6-foot-1 frame to 210 pounds, will also play on special teams.

In 1989 he played in all 11 EMU games, recording five tackles.

Marshall, whose injury report reads like a rap sheet, has something to prove in his final year of eligibility. He sat out the 1990 season with a knee injury, a torn anterior cruciate ligament suffered that year during spring practice on the artificial practice surface at the University of Michigan.

"I'd be lying to say that you're the same (after knee surgery)," Marshall said. "You can't run as fast or jump as high. There's swelling in my left leg. Sometimes it doesn't ever go down, but I can come very close to being where I once was."

After going in for surgery in April of 1990, Marshall began practicing again with the Eagles late last season, only to be sidelined again with a broken thumb (torn ligament), which required surgery.

"I sat out last year because my knee was not totally better," he said. "It's tough, anyway, to come back in six months."

"But I did everything right as far

as rehabilitation. I'm happy with the way it is. I dedicated myself for once this summer. It's a lot stronger."

AFTER A SUCCESSFUL spring practice and summer of weightlifting and running, Marshall is anxious to start the season. He hopes EMU can do an about-face after a dismal 2-9 showing in 1990.

"It's hard to say if we'll be as good

as the 1987 California Bowl team," said Marshall, who was a freshman that championship season. "I think we'll be one of the most improved teams (in the Mid-American Conference). I see a lot of new faces. The key is the younger players and how they develop. We have a good bunch of seniors. It's an interesting mix."

Marshall, who earned a scholarship after walking on, is glad he was given one more chance to contribute.

"I have no complaints about the way I've been treated here," he said. "I have nothing but respect for coach (Jim) Harkema."

And someday Marshall hopes to earn that same respect as a police officer.

LOCAL EMU FOOTBALL NOTES: Several area players will figure prominently in the Eagles' 1991 season.

Chris Cox, a junior (eligibility wise) from Farmington Hills, returns at linebacker where he finished sixth last season in tackles. The 6-3, 230-pound Cox had 29 solos and 21 assists in 1990.

Chris Parenti, a 6-2, 234-pound senior line-

backer from Livonia Franklin, also returns after

playing in eight games last season (including one start). He returns from hernia surgery.

Mike Boyle, a 6-3, 260-pound offensive tackle from Redford St. Agatha, may get the starting call. The red-shirt junior "could be an interesting piece of the puzzle," according to Harkema. "He's shown a lot of ability and we're hoping he'll come through," said the EMU coach.

Bryan Wauldon, another red-shirt junior from Harrison, could also fit a void at wide receiver. "He's finally at a point where he's healthy, he'll have a chance to impact because he's plenty good enough," said Harkema of the 6-2, 180-pound pass catcher.

Dennis Parker, a 6-3, 251-pound red-shirt sophomore from Redford Bishop Borgess, will see back-up duty on the defensive line.

The incoming freshman class includes defensive back Mike Thomas (Redford Catholic Central), who could see considerable action along with tailback David Dobbins (Borgess), fullback Scott Nichols (Harrison) and defensive tackle Bobby Johnson — that latter three are walk-ons.

"We're kind of excited (about Johnson) because he comes on a good recommendation from his high school coach Armand Vigne, and he played in the All-Star game," Harkema said. "You never know. He's shown some toughness in the early going."

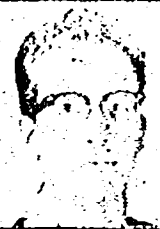

in with 'Comfort'

Poor Natasha Richardson. The actress daughter of Vanessa Redgrave and Tony Richardson has suffered unspeakably in every movie I've seen her in.

She was prone to drug-induced hallucinations in Ken Russell's "Gothic," locked in a closet as "Patty Hearst" and forced to breed against her will in "The Handmaid's Tale."

"The Comfort of Strangers" continues that trend. She heads a quartet of captivating actors in a film that has atmosphere to spare, but is mostly an emotional dud. It plays at Ann Arbor's Michigan Theatre after a weekend run at the Detroit Film Theatre.

Richardson (as Mary) and handsome Rupert Everett (as Colin) are lovers vacationing in Venice who meet a perverse Venetian bar owner, wonderfully played by Christopher Walken.

Dressed in a clean white suit and sporting an accent more Transylvanian than Italian, spooky Robert invites them home for the night.

**WRONG MOVE.** The apartment is a half-museum, half-mausoleum collection of family artifacts, lined with what appear to be priceless classically painted murals on the walls and doors.

His wife, Caroline (Helen Mirren of "The Cook, the Thief..."), speaks openly about sex and admits

that she sneaked into the couple's room to watch them sleep.

Robert and Colin, meanwhile, discuss the inventory of the house, including books and opera glasses that once belonged to Robert's father. When Colin makes an offhand comment about "preserving the good old days," his host casually reels back and punches him hard in the stomach.

When Mary happens upon a recently snapped photograph of Colin, she doesn't think much of it until it's too late.

**WHILE THE** lovers are easy to read, Robert requires heavy analysis, so screenwriter (but mostly playwright) Harold Pinter leaves clues lying all over the place. Even when adapting someone else's material (a book by Ian McEwan), he keeps the dialogue dry and motivations ambiguous.

We are supposed to be captivated by the eerie effect that this meeting has on the lovers and how it brings them together both emotionally and sexually. This is just an excuse for a lot of artistically shot sex scenes.

By the time "The Comfort of Strangers" reaches its shattering (but oddly natural) conclusion, we don't care a whole lot.

**DIRECTOR** Paul Schrader hit his stride when writing the script for "Taxi Driver" in 1976 and has since

directed films like this — thematically fascinating oddities that should be a whole lot better.

He has some awesome talent to work with for this Italian production, including composer Angelo Badalamenti and production designer Gianni Quaranta.

And the ever-suffering Natasha Richardson?

By this time, the only thing left is for someone to cast her in a film where she's torn apart by wild wolves. I'm waiting for a straight drama where she isn't constantly upstaged by the bizarre goings-on.

## Not so wild about 'Wild at Heart'

Any number of adjectives can be, and have been, used to describe David Lynch's films and television show: interesting, strange, funny, violent, disturbing. Clearly he is not a writer/director everyone will appreciate.

Lynch's best known film, "Blue Velvet," was strikingly original. It was a tightly focused film with some truly weird characters and a plot that had some strange refractions.

There are scenes in that movie that I've never forgotten, Dennis Hopper inhaling from his gas mask and Dean Stockwell's Roy Orbison with a work light as a baby spotlight. Even now, if I happen to catch Bob Vinton singing "Blue Velvet" while riding in an elevator, I mentally hear Isabella Rossellini's incredibly off-key warbling.

I was expecting to really like Lynch's most recent film, last year's "Wild at Heart." Unfortunately, I was disappointed.

"Wild at Heart" starts out with abrupt violence, as Sailor Ripley fends off a knife-wielding assailant who was sent after him by his girlfriend's mother and who attacks him outside a nightclub. Girlfriend Lula, played by Laura Dern, stands by

screaming.

Lula's mother, Marietta, played by Dern's real life mother Diane Ladd, watches as the first of many plots against Sailor, played by Nicolas Cage, go awry.

The next scenes take place months later when Sailor is released from prison after paying his debt to society for killing the assailant.

"THIS SNAKESKIN" jacket represents a symbol of my individuality and my belief in personal freedom," Sailor says upon being reunited with his girl and favorite article of clothing.

Lynch's wry sense of humor is present in a later scene when Sailor describes how he got to that point in his life: "I never had much parental guidance. The public defender kept saying that at my parole hearing."

Cage's Sailor sometimes slips into Elvis Presley speech and manner-

isms, serenading Lula at a nightclub, backed by a punk band. With her high heels and skimpy halter tops, Lula and Sailor are couple made for each other.

Meanwhile, Marietta is still scheming to get Sailor out of the picture, sending two different boyfriends in pursuit as the couple heads for California.

The film contains innumerable references to the "Wizard of Oz" and Ladd's Marietta looks like Glinda the Good Witch but acts and cackles like the Wicked Witch. Rather than Dorothy taking her life to Oz, Lula has bits of Oz filtering into her real life.

Lynch has a pattern of being unable to deal with middle-aged wom-

en characters, presenting them as violent harpies or loons. Dressed like an average prom queen with more blond wigs than Dolly Parton and spear-like red finger nails, Ladd is just about able to hold her own. This is a seriously deranged woman.

**THER ARE** some interesting things in the movie. Dern has a scene looking into the mirror that closely parallels one earlier involving Ladd. It's especially creepy, with a strong facial resemblance between the women.

The acting styles, especially by Cage, are inconsistent — sometimes naturalistic and at other times arch and mannered.

There was no suspense to the story, what happens is utterly predictable and spelled out for you well in advance. A number of familiar faces from other Lynch films and the television show "Twin Peaks" pop up doing strange little turns in the film. Those non sequitur scenes don't work in a film so loose and unfocused. These type of detours really need to have a point of reference.

# Dazzle guests with lamb

To keep that summer party exciting, you might want to try serving something a little different this year from the usual hamburger or chicken fare. One suggestion is grilled lamb — one of the "in" foods for 1991.

Leaner than ever before, this meat offers great taste and nutrition in a variety of recipes requiring only minutes of preparation.

Favored for the grill are some of the new, smaller lamb cuts now sold in your local supermarket. Very popular for the summer cookout are kebabs, which may be sold prepackaged or easily cut from a sirloin roast or leg.

Taken from the leanest part of the lamb, with only 176 calories per three-ounce serving, kebabs offer a lot of fun on a skewer accompanied by a medley of vegetables or fruits.

To cook your kebabs to perfection, stack briquets in a pyramid and preheat coals 20-40 minutes until bright red and covered with gray ash. After spreading briquets evenly apart, you can test for the proper moderate temperature when you comfortably can hold your palm approximately four inches above the coals for four seconds.

In the recipe, "Stars and Stripes Lamb Kebabs," lamb cubes are marinated in dry red wine or orange juice, broth, grape jelly, red wine vinegar, garlic, rosemary, marjoram, bay leaf, salt and ginger.

When you're ready to start the meal, skewer alternating pieces of lamb and onion, ending with a red pepper star. Once placed on the fire, the kebabs grill in 10-12 minutes. Serve with a Blueberry Rice Salad of fresh blueberries, cooked rice, sliced almonds and a sweet vinaigrette.

## LAMB KEBABS

(4 servings)  
1 1/2 pounds fresh American lamb sirloin roast, cut into 2 inch cubes  
1 small onion, cut into 2 inch strips  
1 red pepper, cut into 4 star shapes  
1 recipe marinade

## MARINADE

1/2 cup dry red wine or orange juice  
1/4 cup broth  
3 tablespoons grape jelly  
3 tablespoons red wine vinegar  
3 garlic cloves, minced  
2 teaspoons dried rosemary leaves, crushed  
2 teaspoons dried marjoram leaves, crushed  
1 bay leaf  
1 teaspoon seasoned salt  
1 teaspoon finely-minced fresh ginger

In medium bowl, blend marinade ingredients. Add lamb cubes, cover, refrigerate and marinate 4-24 hours. Mix several times.

Remove meat from marinade and thread on skewers, alternating meat and onion, ending with red pepper star.

To broil: Place lamb kebabs on cold broiler pan. Broil lamb 4 inches from source of heat 5-6 minutes per side for medium rare.

To grill: Ignite coals in barbecue; allow to burn until bright red and covered with gray ash. Grill lamb kebabs 4 inches from coals 5-6 minutes per side for medium rare.

## BLUEBERRY RICE SALAD

3 cups cooked rice  
1 cup fresh blueberries  
1/2 cup toasted sliced almonds  
1/2 cup sweet vinaigrette

In medium bowl, combine rice, blueberries, almonds and vinaigrette. Toss and serve with kebabs.

The Chateau Fuisse vineyards encompass about 100 separate parcels of land midway up slopes in both the Pouilly and Fuisse districts. Each offers a distinct character to the wine and is vinified separately to maintain the original identity of the vineyard section.

After vinification, lots are blended to offer the consumer the consistent and inimitable Chateau Fuisse style. A limited 13,000 cases of Chateau Fuisse are produced each vintage.

THE 1989 Chateau Fuisse (\$38) is pricey by the mere fact of its rarity. It's generous and extracted, mirroring the characteristics described for the regular Pouilly-Fuisse (see Wine Selections of the Week), but is a significantly bigger wine.

If you decide to buy this wine, remember the directive on Chateau Fuisse's cellar wall, inscribed in 1955 by the local tax collector. It translates, "It's better to put your nose in a glass of Chateau Fuisse than in your neighbor's business."

## WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

J.J. Vincent 1990 Pouilly-Fuisse (\$18) is highlighted by hints of toasty bread aromas with well-structured chardonnay flavors that are well-balanced and delicious. This is a handsome chardonnay from southern Burgundy.

J.J. Vincent 1990 Macon-Villages (\$11) has appealing apple, pear and melon aromas with vanilla accents. The expressive flavors and generous finish make it a value-priced wine.

about 1,700 acres in the southern Maconnais. Vincent's vineyard sources in Fuisse, constituting about 1/2 of the blend, are selected for their lively chardonnay fruit, producing a wine of depth and richness.

"POUILLY-FUISSE chardonnay is not as sophisticated as a Meursault or Puligny," Vincent contends. "It is also not as pricey and is a perfect wine for fish and lighter food preparations. It is a soft, pleasant white wine that makes a good value for aging."

Macon-Villages is the largest appellation in the Maconnais, with nearly 6,000 acres. Vincent's wine (100 percent chardonnay) is a blend of three villages. The first offers a muscat character elevating the wine's aromas. The second lends structure to the wine, and the last gives finesse and elegance to the wine as a whole.

"Blending wines from three villages builds a more harmonious wine," Vincent said. "The 1990 Macon-Villages is one of the best in the last 10 years. The acid levels are balanced and the wine overall is much better than the 1989."

The vineyard sources for the St. Veran wine are in the northern part of the appellation. The area produces chardonnay wines with both pear and peach aromas and flavors.

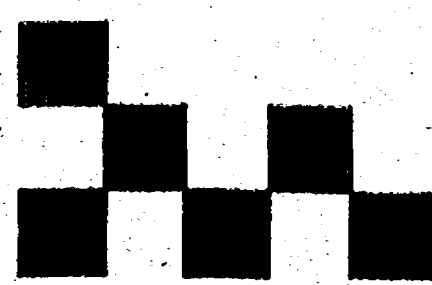

## Juicy tips for grilling burgers

I love summer. I enjoy getting out of the kitchen and expanding my experiences on the grill.

I like experimenting with grilled vegetables, ribs, chicken and fish — and, of course, the ever-popular hot dogs and burgers.

Last week, the Janes Gang gathered at the McLouth Steel Retirees Picnic with Mom and Dad and enjoyed juicy burgers, cooked to perfection over red-hot coals.

But what goes into making the best grilled burgers?

Ground beef is sold in every supermarket I have ever walked into. Does hamburger make the best hamburgers? Just how lean is lean? And which is the best choice? Ground chuck? Ground sirloin?

**THE NAME** "hamburger," or chopped or ground beef, means solely that this product is made from 100 percent beef. No water, binders or fillers may be added.

It must contain at least 70 percent lean meat. But what about the other 30 percent, you ask? Fat, plain, pure and artery-hardening fat.

Many markets are getting into the habit of labeling their ground beef mixture by the percentage of fat within the mixture. The level of fat is not regulated by the USDA.

Most markets also designate which part of the animal the meat primarily comes from. Is ground chuck better than ground round?

**THERE IS** more than one "best" choice, depending on how you use ground beef. For strict fat-controlled diets, the leanest meat obviously has the least amount of fat.

But, since fat also gives flavor and moisture to meat, super-lean meat may easily become dry and crumbly, especially if overcooked.

Leaner ground beef makes great rare burgers, but if you like them a little more cooked, I suggest ground chuck.

**I CAN** vividly remember Mom going into the A&P in Wyandotte and searching through all the packages of stewing beef looking for the leanest one.

Then, and only then, would she hand the package to the butcher and direct him to "fresh grind" her some ground stewing beef.

Old habits die hard. I still do that, even at my favorite butcher shop.

Even ground turkey and ground chicken can make decent burgers, with a little help.

**RIGHT OFF** the bat, you must know that these products are very lean and can use some additional fat, or at least a healthy slathering of oil, during the grilling process.

Also, be aware that both ground chicken and turkey are virtually tasteless, so they lend themselves to being mixed with herbs, spices and other additions that make flavorful burgers.

When I get in the mood to grill burgers, I light the coals and wait until I get a gray ash over all the coals (too hot cooks too fast).

**THE JANES** Gang kids like their burgers plain. Depending on my mood, I might stir in some chopped green chile peppers and a little taco seasoning for a South-of-the-border treat that can't be beat.

For an Oriental flavor, I might toss in some finely chopped water chestnuts and a slathering of hoisin or soy sauce.

A personal favorite is my famous "French" burgers, made into patties with a crumbling of bleu cheese, a little onion, some Dijon mustard and a sprinkling of tarragon. Talk about a flavorful burger!

# Warming up for the State Fair

## Baker rises to to the top in yeast breads

**A**T 6:30 a.m., Aug. 18, Larry Galbraith began a gruelling 18-hour marathon. Like a top-seeded athlete pitted against the best in the field, he'd spent weeks getting ready for his annual ordeal.

Galbraith's gear had been ready for a week: 40 pounds of bread flour, a 2-pound bag of dried yeast, eggs, milk, sugar, spices, butter and dried fruits. New August potatoes from a favorite supplier at the Eastern Market were at hand. Larry Galbraith was warming up for the yeast breads competition at the Michigan State Fair!

"It's usually the hottest Sunday of the year," said Galbraith. "I enter 10 different categories. That means I have to turn out 10 perfect examples of yeast breads, rolls, and coffee cakes on Sunday, and deliver them to the fairgrounds for judging on Monday."

"I've worked out a schedule beforehand — there are 10 different rising times, and several different oven temperatures involved. But the schedule is subject to the weather."

**"IN HOT,** muggy weather the yeast works faster, and the dough tends to be stickier. Don't ever let anybody tell you that yeast baking is an exact science!"

Galbraith's love affair with yeast began in 1983, when he took a baking class through an adult education program. He was just "looking for something different to do."

"I had fooled around with frozen dough, and I figured there had to be a better way," he said.

"After I took the class, I started baking three or four nights a week. I gave it to neighbors, to co-workers at the New York Carpet World (Galbraith is manager, customer relations), to my three teenagers and their friends. It became a family tradition that I make pizza for Sunday dinner."

"I love yeast — I bake nothing but yeast breads. It takes time to understand yeast and flours; you don't get the feel for doughs overnight."

**WHEN GALBRAITH** isn't in active competition, he's a coach. In 1988, he began teaching bread-making in the Southfield adult education program.

The class is strictly hands-on," says Galbraith. "There are six ovens available, so class size is limited to 12 people. There are six 3-1/2-hour sessions, and they begin baking the first night."

"We start with a basic white bread, and the second week I show them how to make a classic braided egg bread. By week three, they're getting pretty good, so we make potato bread and English muffin bread."

"Week four, we make coffee cake; weeks five and six are usually determined by the time of year. The class has a vote. If it's a fall class, we concentrate on the upcoming holidays, for spring we make Easter breads."

"And, somewhere along the line, we make rolls. Everybody who has ever taken my class has wanted to learn how to make rolls."

**GALBRAITH GLADLY** shares all of his knowledge and techniques with his classes. "One of the hardest things for beginners to recognize is when dough has been over- or under-floured. They'll add as much flour as the recipe calls for, whether the dough needs it or not."

"I tell them that if the dough has cracks in it, it's over-floured. Just run it under the tap for a second to add a little moisture."

"If you cut the dough in half, and press your finger against the cut side, your finger should pull away without sticking. If your finger sticks, the dough needs more flour."

But Galbraith doesn't just abandon his students after six weeks. They have his home phone number and are free to call him if they get stuck in the middle of a recipe.

"Our phone rings off the wall Thanksgiving and Christmas mornings. It's 'Help Mr. G, my bread won't rise. What am I doing wrong?'"

"MR. G." walks them through the steps until he's found the problem, and then he goes back to his own holiday baking.

"One day, I spent almost two hours on the phone with a student, and I just couldn't spot what he was doing wrong. Finally, he told me he was trying to raise the dough in a microwave oven."

"Yeast won't grow in a microwave because there's no air circulation!"

Galbraith's children coaxed him to enter the Michigan State Fair competition in 1985. First time out, he won five ribbons for 8 entries.

"I felt pretty good when I picked up the ribbons. Then I found out there were 1,400 entries, and I felt even better!"

In 1990, his 10 entries earned nine ribbons. Altogether, since 1985, Galbraith has earned 47 ribbons.

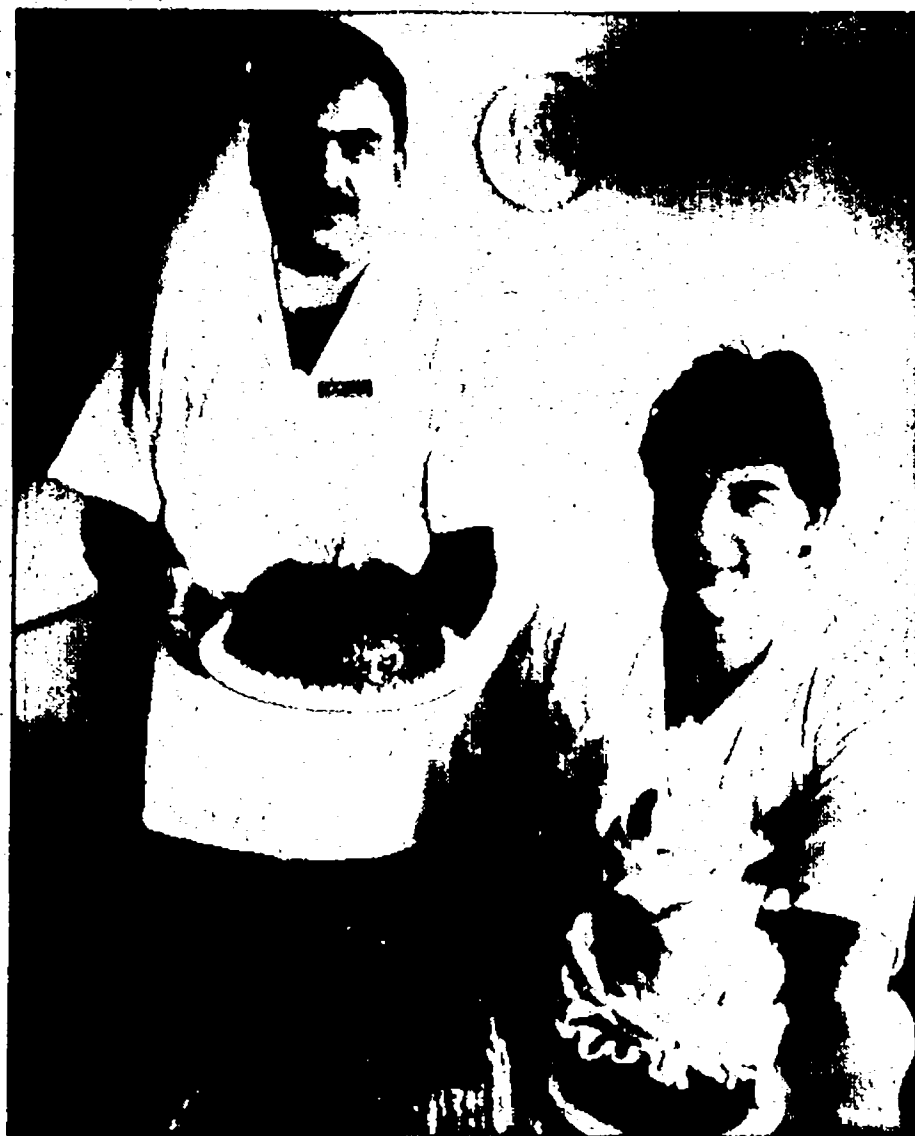
But he's never won a first for white bread. "Last year, I thought it was perfect. But I only won a second. This year it's going to win!"

Sweet Dreams offers 12 flavors of cakes and cheese cakes, seven varieties of ice cream cake and eight ice cream flavors.

"We really have good experience and do fancy, fancy cakes. A fancy cake is hard to make, I like the challenge," said his brother Sam, 25, who

learned pastry-making from his brother.

# To make prize-winning breads you knead dough

**OLD FASHIONED POTATO BREAD**  
(Michigan State Fair first prize winner, 1986 through 1990)  
½ cup mashed potatoes  
1 cup potato water, reserved from boiling potatoes  
2 pkgs. dry yeast  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1 tablespoon salt (less if you're watching your salt intake)  
1 cup warm milk  
6½ to 7½ cups bread flour

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.  
In a large bowl, sprinkle yeast and ¼ tablespoon sugar over warm potato water. Let stand until foamy, about 5-8 minutes. Heat milk with margarine or butter until temperature is approximately 105-115 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, combine 4 cups of bread flour, the remaining sugar and salt. Add milk and mashed potatoes to dry mixture. Blend until smooth. Add the yeast mixture and stir in enough additional flour to make a stiff dough.

Turn out onto lightly floured board. Knead, adding additional flour as necessary, until smooth and elastic, about 8 to 10 minutes. Place in a large bowl that has been coated with vegetable oil; turn dough to grease top. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and a towel. Let rise in a warm place until dough is double in size, about 30 minutes. Punch dough down, turn over in bowl. Cover and let rise again for about 20 minutes.

Punch dough down. Turn out onto lightly floured board and knead to get the air bubbles out of the dough, about 3 to 4 minutes.

Divide dough according to the number of bread pans you are using. Roll each portion of dough into a 14-x-9-inch rectangle. Fold and shape the dough into loaves and place in greased loaf pans. Cover with plastic wrap and towel and let rise in a warm place, away from drafts, until it doubles in size and fills the bread pans, about 40 to 60 minutes. Remove coverings. Lightly sift flour onto tops of loaves. Bake at 375 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes or until loaves sound hollow when tapped on the bottom. Remove from pans immediately and cool on wire rack.

Yield: 2 loaves if using 9½-x-5½-inch-x-2¼-inch pans, 3 loaves if using 8½-x-4½-x-2½-inch pans.

## DINNER ROLLS

Everyone always asks about making dinner rolls. White bread or potato bread make excellent rolls. Remember, you're using smaller amounts of dough (less volume), so baking time will always be less than for baking loaves of bread.

Use 8-inch, 9-inch, or 10-inch cake pans. If you use muffin tins, 90 percent of the rolls will be crust because of the small amount of dough used. After dough rises, punch it down, and divide into 2½-3-oz smooth balls. You'll need six balls in the 8-inch, seven in the 9-inch, and eight in the 10-inch pan. Place balls in greased pan, spacing ¼ inch apart. Brush with butter or margarine and cover with plastic wrap and a towel. In warm place, let rise for 35-40 minutes or until doubled in size. Remove towel and plastic wrap and bake for 16-20 minutes in a preheated 375 degree oven. Be sure

to test bottoms for the hollow sound to be sure the rolls are done. Transfer to a wire rack and paint them again with butter or margarine. Cool for approximately 20 minutes and serve.

## MR. G'S WHITE BREAD

This recipe makes two loaves and takes about three hours to make.

1 package dry yeast  
3 tablespoons sugar  
½ cup warm water  
¼ cup (½ stick) margarine or butter  
¼ cup milk  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 large egg  
4 to 4 ½ cups bread flour or all-purpose flour

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.  
Dissolve yeast and ¼ teaspoon of the sugar in the ½ cup warm water. Water should be 110-115 degrees. Let mixture sit for about 10 minutes. (Bubbles indicate active yeast). In the meantime, heat the margarine and milk in a saucepan until the margarine is almost melted. Set

aside to cool. Measure remaining sugar and salt into a good-sized mixing bowl. Test milk mixture to make sure it does not exceed 125 degrees and pour into bowl. Add the sugar and salt; mix well. Add 2 cups of flour, mix well. Add another cup of flour and the egg. Add the yeast mixture and stir well. Beat or mix vigorously for 3 to 5 minutes. Add the remainder of the flour to make a soft dough.

Lift dough from the bowl and knead on a floured surface until dough is smooth and elastic, 5 to 8 minutes. Shape the dough into a ball. Turn it into a greased bowl, turning

dough to grease the top. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and a towel. Let rise for approximately one hour in a warm, draft-free place until it has doubled in size. Punch the dough down and knead lightly. Form the dough into loaves, put into greased pans and paint top of dough with melted margarine or butter. Cover lightly with plastic wrap and towel. Let rise for one hour. Remove plastic wrap and towel and place into preheated 400 degree oven. Bake 30-35 minutes or until loaves are golden brown and sound hollow when tapped on the bottom. Remove from pans immediately. Cool on wire racks.

### FRENCH BURGERS

10 ounces ground beef  
1 tablespoon chopped shallot  
dash dried tarragon  
fresh-ground black pepper  
1 ounce Roquefort cheese, crumbled  
12 tablespoons Dijon mustard

Combine all ingredients and mix well. Cook as desired on grill.

### ORIENTAL BURGERS

10 ounces ground beef  
2 water chestnuts, minced fine  
1 green onion, chopped fine  
1 tablespoon hoisin sauce  
1 teaspoon soy sauce  
¼ teaspoon ground ginger

Combine all ingredients and mix well. Shape into hamburger patties and cook as directed on grill.

### MEXICAN BURGERS

10 ounces ground beef  
1 tablespoon minced jalapeno pepper  
¼ teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon salsa  
2 thin slices Monterey Jack cheese

## Use low-fat spreads on oatmeal bread

AP — Home-baked loaves of bread are like green salads and baked potatoes: it's not what's in them that raises the fat quotient, it's what you put on top. For this whole-grain bread, choose low-fat spreads such as mustard or reduced-calorie mayonnaise for sandwiches, and jams or fruit preserves for toast.

### OATMEAL BREAD

4¼ to 4½ cups all-purpose flour  
1 package active dry yeast  
1½ cups water  
½ cup packed brown sugar  
3 tablespoons shortening, margarine,

or butter  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 cups quick-cooking or regular rolled oats

In a large mixer bowl combine 2 cups of the all-purpose flour and the yeast. In a saucepan heat and stir water, brown sugar, shortening and salt until warm (120 to 130 degrees) and shortening almost melts. Add to flour mixture. Beat with an electric mixer on low speed for 30 seconds, scraping bowl constantly. Beat on high speed for 3 minutes. Using a spoon, stir in the rolled oats and as

much of the remaining flour as you can.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead in enough of the remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough that is smooth and elastic (6 to 8 minutes total). Shape into a ball. Place in a lightly greased bowl; turn once. Cover and let rise in a warm place until double, about 1 to 1½ hours.

Punch dough down. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Divide in half. Cover and let rest for 10 minutes. Lightly grease two 8-by-4-by-2-

inch loaf pans. Shape each half of the dough into a loaf. Place in pans. Cover; let rise in a warm place until nearly double (45 to 60 minutes).

Bake in a 375-degree oven for 40 to 45 minutes or until done. Cover loosely with foil the last 10 to 20 minutes, if necessary, to prevent overbrowning. Remove from pans; cool. Makes 2 loaves (32 slices).

Seek and ye shall find in Amish country

GOSHEN, IND.: I met Bill and June Lewis of Farmington Hills in the pottery shop of the Old Bag Factory. That's not a place that makes old bags, it's an old soap factory reincarnated as a craft center in Goshen.

If you haven't been to Goshen lately, you'll find it across the Indiana state line south of Kalamazoo in Elkhart County. It is east of Wakarusa and Nappanee, southwest of Middlebury and Shipshewana, in the heart of Indiana Amish country.

The Lewises sometimes make the three-hour drive to this area for the day, sometimes for the weekend. "It's a whole different slower way of life, and we find it very peaceful and relaxing," June said.

"We don't go to the weekly antique auctions and flea market in Shipshewana, because the town is so crowded, but we love weekends. You can park and walk down all the side roads and into the shops, which are full of country crafts."

THERE ARE several bed and breakfast places around Amish country; June and Bill usually stay at Green Meadows, where a Mennonite couple called Ruth and Paul Miller raise miniature horses and serve a good Amish breakfast in their home set way back from the road north of town.

"Shipshewana is good for country crafts but not for antiques," June said. "We couldn't get into Green Meadows this trip, so we went to Goshen."

That's where I met them, at the Old Bag factory, a complex of old brick buildings on Chicago Avenue, built in 1895 as the Cosmos Buttermilk Soap Factory, reborn as the Chicago-Detroit Bag Co. In 1910, and reincarnated again in 1985 by furniture maker Larion Swartzendruber.

You can stand on a balcony in the large main building and watch Swartzendruber's furniture being made, browse in his showroom, visit a blacksmith and iron-maker outside, hit the quilt shop, buy antiques, or explore stained glass and woodworking shops in a basement level known as Down Under.

June Lewis had the same experience that I had while searching for furniture makers in Amish country. There are a few well-known places, but most are Amish carpenters hidden away in unsigned private homes and farms.

"We went looking for a wagon wheel once, and went down lots of country roads asking questions before we found a wagon maker. He was recommended by somebody."

When I asked around, I heard directions like this: "Chris Bontrager and Menno Yoder make furniture in that house with a trailer behind it just left of the red light in Shipshewana." Or: "There's a man called Lambright in Topeka, Indiana. And another place off State Road 5, take Highway 20 east to the four-way stop."

The moral of this story is: slow down to the pace of black Amish buggies, take time to browse, seek and ye shall find. For more specific information, contact the Elkhart County Convention and Visitors Bureau, 429 South Main St., Elkhart, Ind., 46516 or telephone them at (219) 293-7394.

## Spinning the Shaker story in Kentucky

PLEASANT HILL, KY. — Every time I pick up a broom to sweep my kitchen I will think of this 2,700-acre farm community built by the Shakers before the Civil War.

It was the Shakers, a dissident sect of the Quakers, who first crafted the corn broom, along with the clothespin, washing machine and circular saw.

The Shakers are gone but you can still eat, sleep and tour your way through their 19th century life here in Shaker Village.

Mares and colts grazed the countryside, beside black Angus cattle and Border Leicester sheep, when we drove to the neatly stacked fieldstone fences of the village.

An interpreter in an ankle-length cotton dress and white net cap welcomed us, gave us a brief introduction to Shaker life and sent us to explore the 30 original structures built here in the early 1800s.

The limestone, brick and clapboard buildings, set off by white picket fences, are furnished with a stunning collection of 2,500 pieces of Shaker furniture and tools.

A friendly guide spun the Shaker story in the 40-room Centre Family Dwelling. An illiterate textile worker called Ann Lee led eight dissi-

dents, seeking religious freedom, from the English factory town of Manchester to the New World in 1774. The United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing settled outside Albany, N.Y., and eventually built 18 colonies stretching from Maine to Indiana.

The Shakers' goal was to create Utopia on earth by practicing celibacy, renouncing worldly possessions and living in communes in a spirit of racial and sexual equality. By 1830, the Pleasant Hill community was a thriving place with 500 residents and some 5,000 acres of land.

Two separate doorways lead into the Centre Family Dwelling — one for women, the other for men. Men and boys slept on one side of the house, women and girls on the other.

"Did anyone ever cheat?" I asked. "The elders dusted the hallways with flour, so cheaters would leave footprints behind," the guide said.

"If the Shakers were celibate, how did the community grow?"

"They took in orphan children and a few converts from the area. When the children became 21, they could decide whether to leave or stay."

Our next stop was at the white frame Meeting House, where a costumed interpreter directed us to a bench, then burst into song. The brothers and sisters of the congregation cleansed themselves of carnal desires by singing and dancing. They shook themselves so violently that they shook the sins out of their bodies.

Shakers worked from sunup

sundown, as their songs were dedicated to worship and work. That work is still visible in the buildings scattered around Shaker Village.

Women card and spin wool, make quilts, dip candles, dry herbs for medicines, weave fabrics and rugs. Men make shoes, flat brooms, shaped oval boxes, barrels and cabinets. The Shakers sold seeds, brooms, herbs and preserves as far away as St. Louis and New Orleans, until the Industrial Revolution and the Civil War weakened their thriving community.

The number of converts and orphans dwindled. By 1910, the 12 remaining Shakers decided their last 1,800 acres to a merchant in nearby Harrodsburg, who looked after them until the last member died in 1923. The village was deteriorating badly

when a preservation group formed in 1963.

Today this outdoor museum flourishes as a monument to a people who believed that perfect craftsmanship reflected their spiritual beliefs.

Twentieth century visitors can see their hand-crafted chairs hung on pegs on the walls of rooms where they once lived.

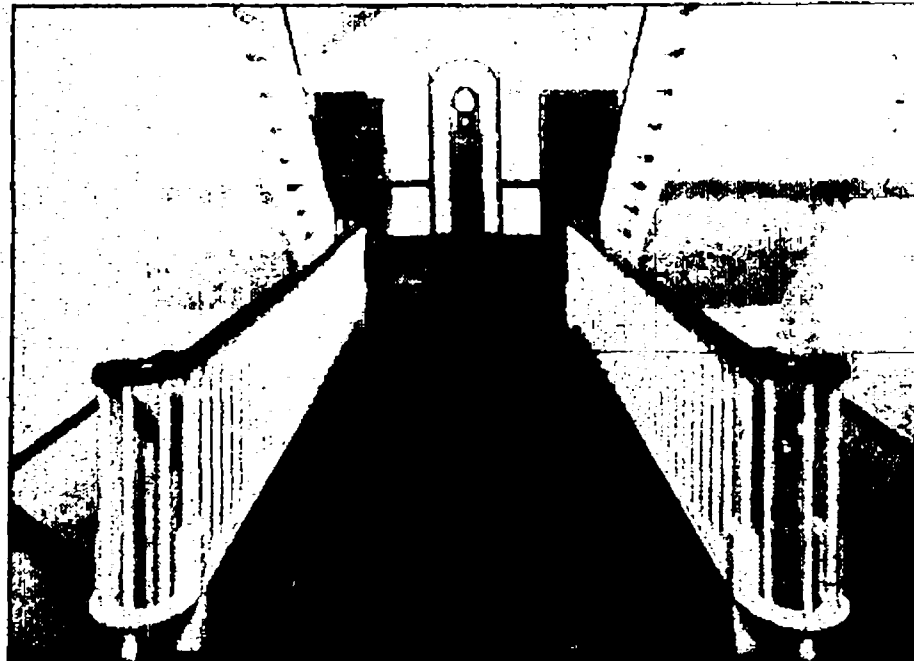
Shaker men and women dined in silence on identical food served in separate rooms. We ate on the same rough-hewn tables, where dinner is served family-style in the former Trustees Office. The meal was beautiful, sumptuous and nicely served by young costumed waitpersons.

We spent the night in one of the 83 guest rooms scattered in 15 buildings on the grounds. The room was

large, comfortable, air-conditioned, with private bath. It was furnished with pieces from the Shaker collection, many of which are available in the gift shops.

We wound up the evening down by the pond skipping stones and watching a mother duck and her brood bobbing about the water. Visitors can also hike or drive to Shaker Landing on the Kentucky River, where the foundations of Shaker warehouses still stand, and take a one-hour tour on the paddlewheeler Dixie Belle.

"We love the idea of staying in an historic place that is both clean and charming. Stay overnight. Imagine what it would be like to stay in Greenfield Village overnight!"

Amy Crumm of Canton worked in a Shaker shop in Ann Arbor several years ago, and learned about Pleasant Hill from a guide book. "We love to go in the early spring, to get away from the drab chilly weather in Michigan. The spring wildflowers are out there."

"I advise people to reserve in advance for the dining room and to stay overnight, especially if they want a specific room. Drive to the Dixie Belle paddle wheel boat on the

nearby Kentucky River. You can walk from the parking lot to a small waterfall and climb the waterfall to the top."
